Lions Club GOOD Award Presentation: Brett Housley presented the GOOD Award to Samuel Klem, Jamie Kopac, and Adam Beery. The students and their parents were commended. Mr. Housley attended the senior awards ceremony and commended the board for the students' continued success.

President's Statement: Mask Mandate and Transgender Subjects – Governor amending mask mandate in Ohio as of June 2. For consistency schools will continue the protocol until the end of the school year on June 4, since most students are not vaccinated. The district will re-evaluate in the fall. As for the transgender topic, the district is following the law and board policy with guidance from the school's attorney regarding discrimination laws Title VII and Title IX. Both employees and students follow. US Supreme Court ruled Title VII includes gender identity and sexual orientation. The president issued an Executive Order to include the US Dept. of Education. Students are taught to follow the law. Has heard concerns about restrooms. There has been a unisex restroom for staff. With students it is more difficult because of the layout of the restrooms but is being worked on. Also heard concerns about pulling students from the class. Curriculum standards mandate this class for 9th graders and there is only one teacher. Anyone with concerns is encouraged to contact the superintendent, school counselors, or use the Google form to voice anonymous questions or concerns. Wanted to address this pre-emptively to let the community know we are following the law regardless of anyone's personal opinion on the topic.

Community Comments:

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Danielle Schinker-Kuharich (3762 New Milford) Has question on plans for student unisex restroom. Feels using the staff restroom would be uncomfortable for students.

Mr. Hawkins – responded the unisex restroom is for one person at a time. It is harder for the students because of the configuration of the restrooms, which have more stalls. Is something we are looking to address.

D. Schinker-Kuharich – Should do all we can to make students feel included. Kids deserve credit for the way they have reacted. Appreciates the thought put into this by the board.

J. Conley – Reiterated the student is using the female student restroom; not the staff restroom

Rev. David Rosenberger (4111 Ruth Dr) – Appreciates Mr. Hawkins, Mr. Mullaly and Mr. Siciliano and knows them personally. Attended Rootstown since first grade. Came tonight to see how this would be addressed. All believe different philosophies of life and personally follows the bible. Has lived 43 years in Rootstown. Opposed to homosexuality but does not hate the person. Concerned for the community and the schools. Came to hear if the Board would address and it has been addressed; not swept under the rug. Was there a slide presentation by the teacher on how to address the teacher and that the teacher would show up on Monday dressed as a drag queen.

Mr. Hawkins – On Friday the teacher took a few minutes of class time to address the topic. The principal and counselor were also in the classroom. The goal was to address any questions and minimize distraction.

Rev. Rosenberger – Doesn't believe in pressing beliefs on others. Prays for the district. Thank you for the time.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission ("Commission") has notified the School District to be approved to participate in the Classroom Facilities Assistance Program this year; and WHEREAS, the School District hereby concurs with, and approves the use of, the findings outlined in the final "Facilities Assessment Report" dated February, 2002 with revisions March 2006, November 2010 and April 2021 for the purpose of developing a master facilities plan. The School District and Commission understand that the use of the Facilities Assessment Report is for the purpose of developing an estimated project budget and scope and that the potential for the existence of undocumented conditions that could increase the final cost of the project does exist; and

WHEREAS, the School District Board hereby concurs with and approves the use of the Enrollment Projections dated April 14, 2021. The School District Board and the Commission acknowledge that actual enrollment status will be reviewed annually; and WHEREAS, the School District acknowledges the Commission recommendation that the School District engage a design and construction professional to assist in the review of the information presented in the Facilities

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Assessment Report. The School District has provided any information available to aid in the identification of any areas of concern for conditions, which cannot be readily observed by standard assessment procedures throughout the School District's facilities and the School District acknowledges that the scope of services provided by the professional authoring the Facilities Assessment Report does not include invasive facilities and grounds investigation; and

WHEREAS, the School District acknowledges that neither the School District nor the Commission have control over conditions which are hidden or otherwise unknown at the conclusion of the assessment report and master facilities plan; and WHEREAS, the School District desires to proceed with the Scope of the Project and Master Facilities Plan as indicated below:

SCOPE OF THE PROJECT: Build one new elementary/middle/high school to house grades PK thru 12; allowance to abate and demolish Rootstown Elementary School, Mabel Schnee Middle School and Ward Davis High School.

State Share:	\$18,726,972
Local Share:	\$26,948,569
Project Budget:	\$45,675,541

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Rootstown Local School District, Portage County, Ohio that the conditional approval as granted by the Commission for the Classroom Facilities project be hereby accepted in accordance with the provisions of ORC Section 3318.05.

A discussion was held regarding the resolution. C. Baldwin reviewed the resolution is a placeholder to keep the district in the queue for state funding for facilities but no further action is required. C. Mullaly and P. McEwuen indicated they met with OFCC rep. Understands the resolution is a placeholder only but feel district is not ready to pursue new facilities. P. McEwuen stated the paperwork is just to keep the place in line with OFCC and costs nothing. A. Waesch indicated this is a procedural step if the district moves forward in the future. For right now, need to focus on operations. Knew there was a three-year window with renewals. C. Mullaly stated there is no money required to keep our place in line in case we win the lottery. A. Waesch wants the minutes to reflect the discussion. T. Siciliano feels the OFCC will change their plans. Not ready to pursue new buildings and is not in favor of staying in the queue. E. Kline feels there is no risk to keep place in line. A. Waesch reminded the board the district would have to pass the bond issue first before the state would provide funds. A. Hawkins stated this will keep our place in line for \$18,000,000. If not, it will go to the next in line. If it passes, the district can simply become a lapsed district. P. McEwuen indicated a no vote would mean no future funding. E. Kline stated the board could move forward in 5 to 10 years and have access to some state funding.
